The fact that the Chapters were not presented in chronological order did not bother me; Mr. Hahn subtly reminds the reader of details from previous chapters so that you can understand the context of the new Chapter. In fact, I liked the way the book covered different topics from trades, players, famous games, to basketball history. It reminded me of the type of discussions fans have when watching a game together: bouncing around from topic to topic. But this time you're reading it from an expert who has all his facts correctly. I definitely learned a lot about the Knicks and the history of basketball and the NBA in general from this book. My minor criticism of the book is that I wish there were more photos. It would have been nice for each of the 100 chapters to have a photo, but I'm sure that gathering and paying for that many photos was cost-prohibitive for the publisher, so only about 1 in 5 Chapters have a photo.
