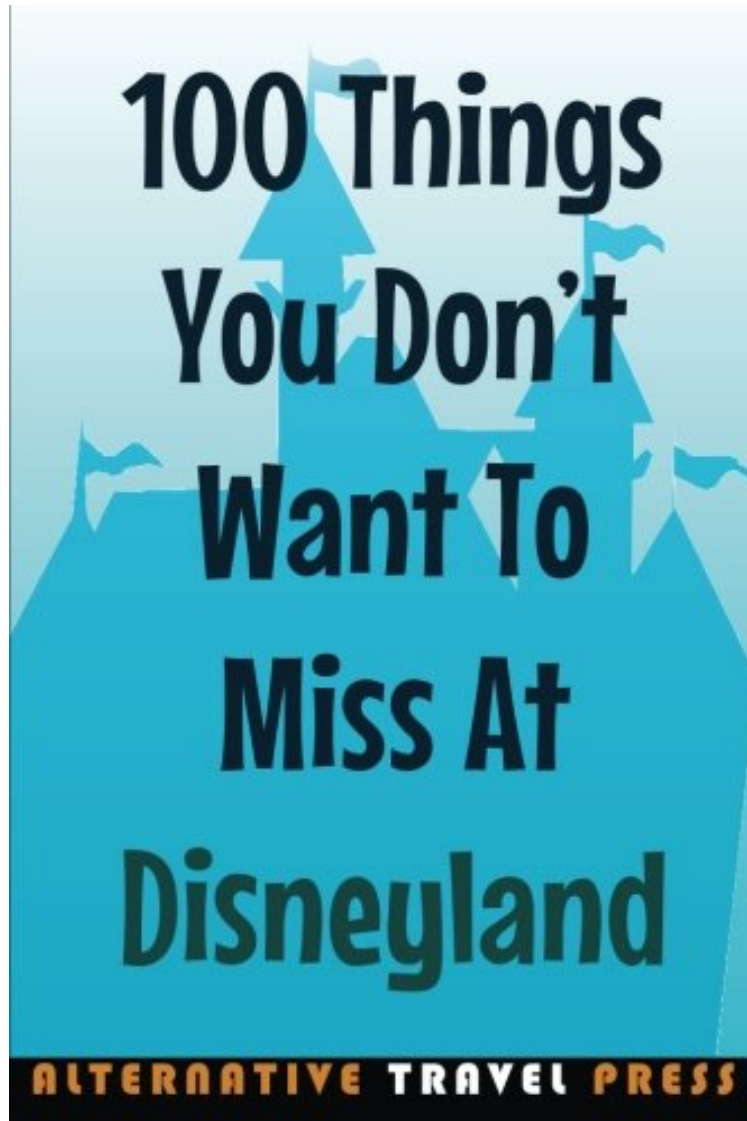

Although many of the "100 Things" are known to most savvy Mouse fans, I found a few even I didn't know, and I'll bet you will also. This book would be great for casual visitors too, since it lists a number of fun things that are easy to miss. Many trivia books cover little things to look for, Hidden Mickeys and the like- but this little gem focuses more on things to do- for example it lists several interesting things to see do at City Hall, areas to Picnic in, so great snack suggestions, and many more. The book is haunted by quite a few small, minor typos.
