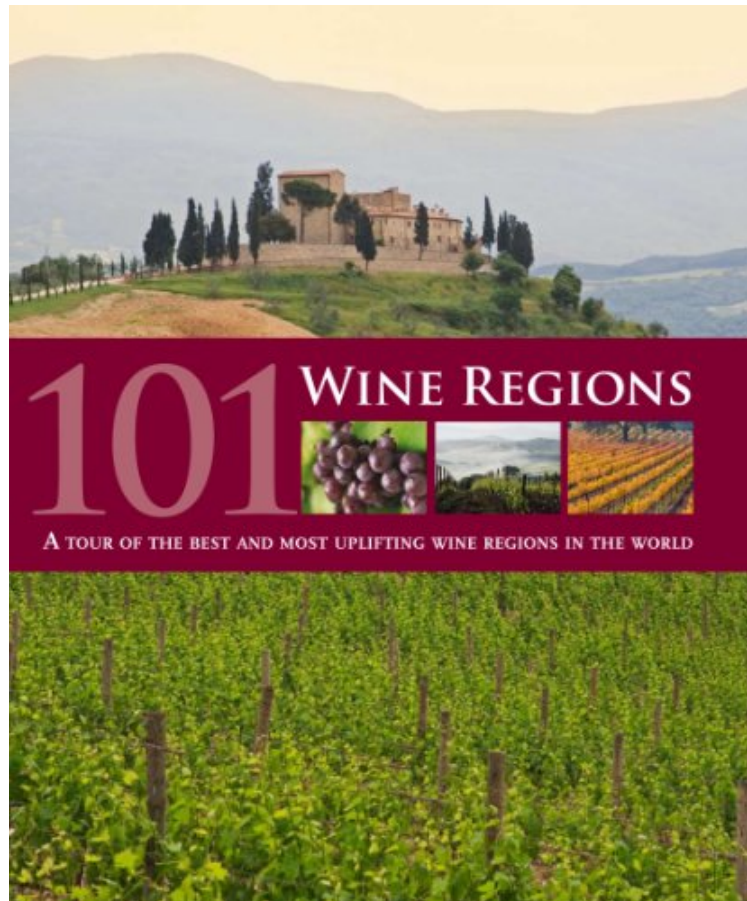

I figured it would be pretty lackluster, but it actually impressed me. I've been in the wine industry for years, so it didn't really give me any new information or insight, but I found that the style, layout, and ease of use would be perfect for beginning wine lovers ready to make the next step in their knowledge of wine.The 230+ page hardcover book is a nice size. The paper is glossy, photos are very nice and high quality. For these reasons alone I enjoy thumbing through it. For those wanting information, this book has a great overview of wine producing countries with notable regions given a page or two. The maps are basic, but well illustrated. The book also does not dumb the information down. For example, an entry about Rias Baixas, Portugal:"The Rias Baixas region is really a collection of

small, distinct areas, mainly clustered around coastal inlets, each of which gives an individual character to its wine through differing aspects and altitudes. Traditionally the vines are trained on pergolas to protect them from humidity. Albarino's bright aromas range from fruity (apple, pear, peach) to floral, and its refreshing acidity and sound structure make it an excellent partner to the local seafood specialties of Galicia. Some producers ferment the wine in barrel for greater structure and complexity, but it is the clean and lively tank-fermented version that captivates the palates of consumers worldwide."Overall I rate this highly as a value wine book with very accurate, though broad, information. In this bright coloured book, two noted authors give their overview of wine regions around the world. The authors claim to highlight the best and most uplifting of the worlds wine regions There are the usual more famous ones like Bordeaux, Medoc and Loire Valley in France and the German areas round the Mosel river Areas. In Italy the many regions like Tuscany and Umbria are discussed, as well as its islands of Sicily and Sardinia. Then there are descriptions specific of varietal grape types like Cabernet Sauvignon, Malbec to Riesling and Gewurztraminer to the newer Pinot Grigio types. The new world is covered to with descriptions of South African, Chilean and Australian wines. This hard bound edition comes with a fly leaf in a small coffee table style which complements the glossy coloured pages, crammed with maps, pictures of famous bottles and gorgeous hill slopes.
