I am more familiar with Baltimore, Annapolis area restaurants, but have been to many of the DC ones too. Many of the restaurants listed have an average price of 25 to 35 dollars which is dinner, a drink and tip. The price range is from a low of \$10 to a high of \$205. Of course at the lower price ones you will probably not feel comfortable in formal clothes or taking your spouse for a special anniversary dinner. With that said, our favorite restaurant for even special occasions is listed at an average cost of \$35. You can find whatever price level and style you want from Ben's Chili Bowl in DC and Ann's Dari Creme in Glen Burnie to the Inn at Little Washington at \$205. Some of the prices even seem a bit high. I dine at the Mitsitam Caf in the Museum of the American Indian on the Mall (believe me it's the best place to eat on the Mall) and do for less than the listed price of \$24.
