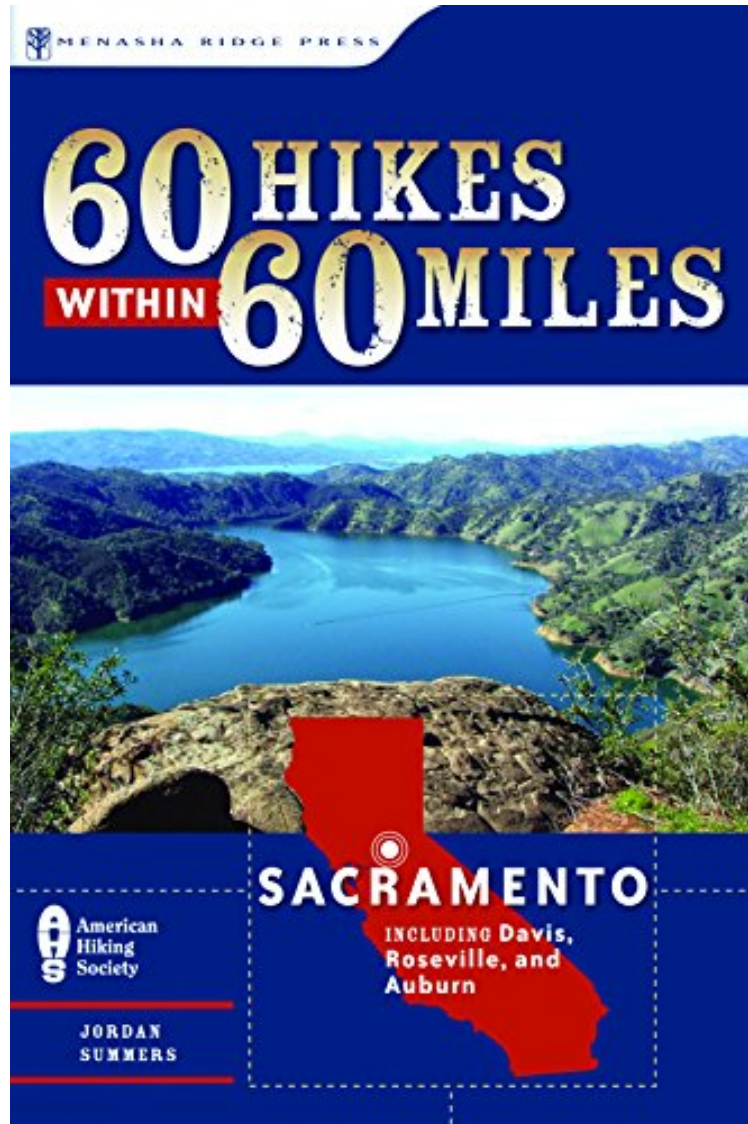

Other than that, this is the best book on hiking this area that I've found, and I particularly appreciate that he mentions exposure (shaded or not), as that can be brutal here for several months of the year. His descriptions of the difficulty seem reasonable compared to my own experience of some of the hikes. I use this book to give me ideas rather than be the only authority on the area, so I usually check out other online maps and satellite images before I take an extended hike. Also, pay attention to what season you're going in, because the waterfalls around here can dry up in the summer and wildflowers are very seasonal.
