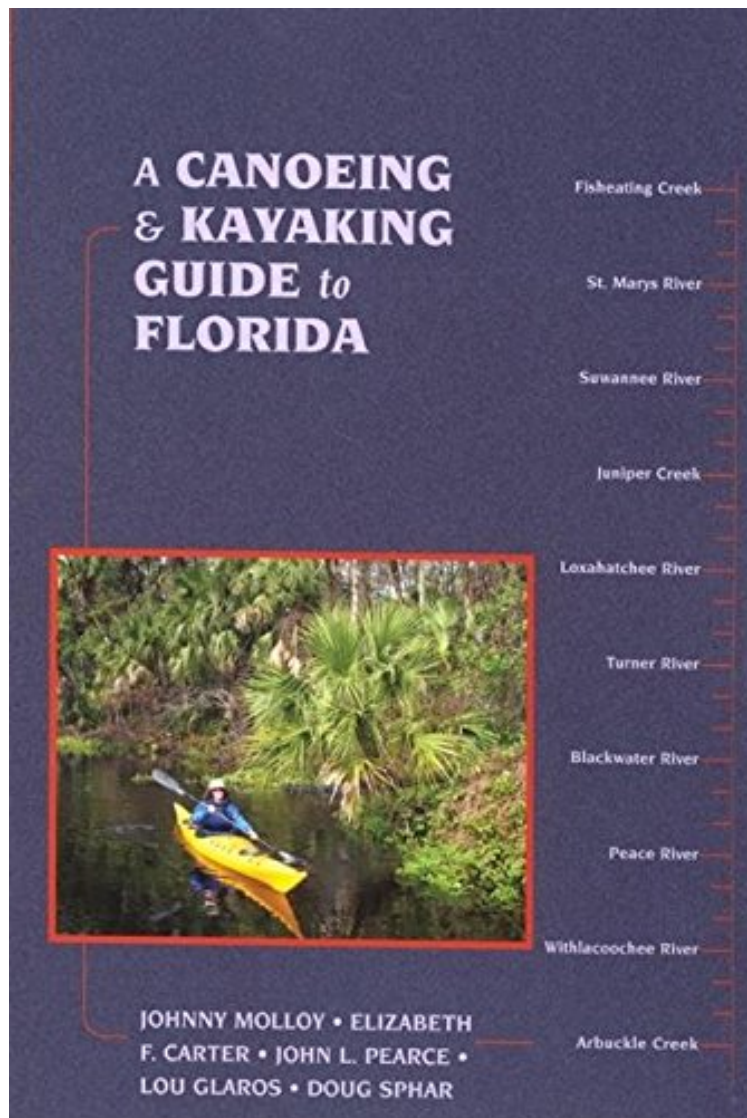

The book breaks the state down into nine geographic sections and cover the rivers and spring-runs in the area with notes, a sketched map (drawn accurately from topo maps) and other info on the waterway being covered.
