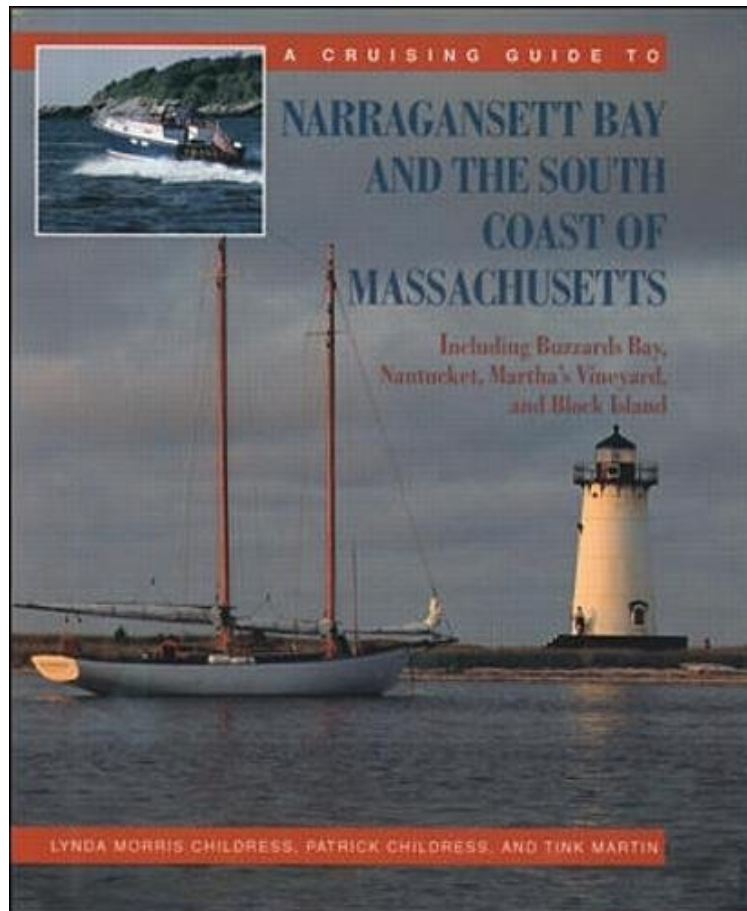

Even though this book is now 20+ years old, it is a FANTASTIC resource!!! The anchorages are still there, the history is still there, and this book documents and explains all of them! I refer to this book every time when planning an overnight cruise, and try to have it aboard so

that my clients can learn more about the area. The book is organized geographically, dividing Narragansett Bay and Buzzards Bay into smaller areas so that you can focus on a specific area. It tells you which NOAA charts cover the area, and it uses the traditional five star rating system for each point of interest. Information on Approaches, Anchorages, Moorings, Fuel, Things to Do, Where to Eat, Recipes(!), Provisioning, History and local Etiquette are presented where relevant. All of the reviews that I have read (it's a BIG book) are spot on. While there are other resources, such as ActiveCaptain, and Waterway Guide, that provide updated versions of some of the information presented in this book, none of them are as comprehensive. I only wish that the authors would revise and update the book. If the authors updated the book, and if the list selling price were \$50 it would be WELL WORTH IT!
