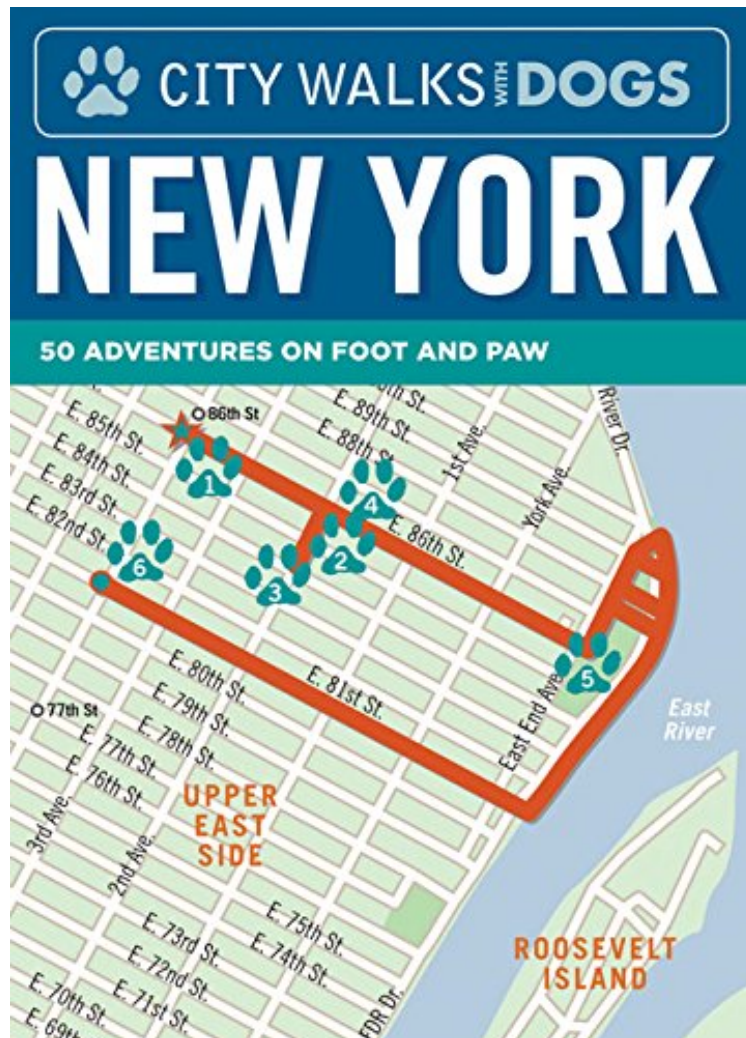

I'm training for the Great Saunter a 34-mile trek around Manhattan that's done each May and requires a lot of training in advance. I thought some of these walks could help me find some new and less boring ways to train. However, once I started looking at these, they are actually shorter, more touristy walks in concentrated

sections of New York. Let me give you an example. Walk Number 1 is Battery Park and Battery Park City, which pretty much covers the area from South Ferry, up the West Side to Vesey Street and to the WTC site. There are lots of things to see on this walk like Castle Clinton, the Peace Sphere (salvaged from the WTC disaster), the Staten Island Ferry and the actual WTC site. One side of the card features a pretty nicely detailed map and the flip side features a description of the walk and the starting point. Some walks are long and some are short. The biggest problem I have with these cards is that they don't provide the mileage, which would be a nice touch and wouldn't take up a lot of space on the card. That was a big oversight. But I can do the research and figure the mileage out myself it's just a nuisance when it could have been added easily. On the shorter walks, I can combine more than one. The cards cover all of Manhattan and a couple of Brooklyn walking sites. They're well-made and easily understandable. Recommend for tourists, not for natives like me.

Whether vacationing with a canine companion or simply straying from the neighborhood walking routine, dog owners will love to discover so many pet-friendly attractions and routes they never knew existed. Pick a card, grab the leash, and tell Fido it's W-A-L-K time! Walks include: SoHo and the West Village Central Park Brooklyn Bridge Roosevelt Island Park Slope's Fifth Avenue
