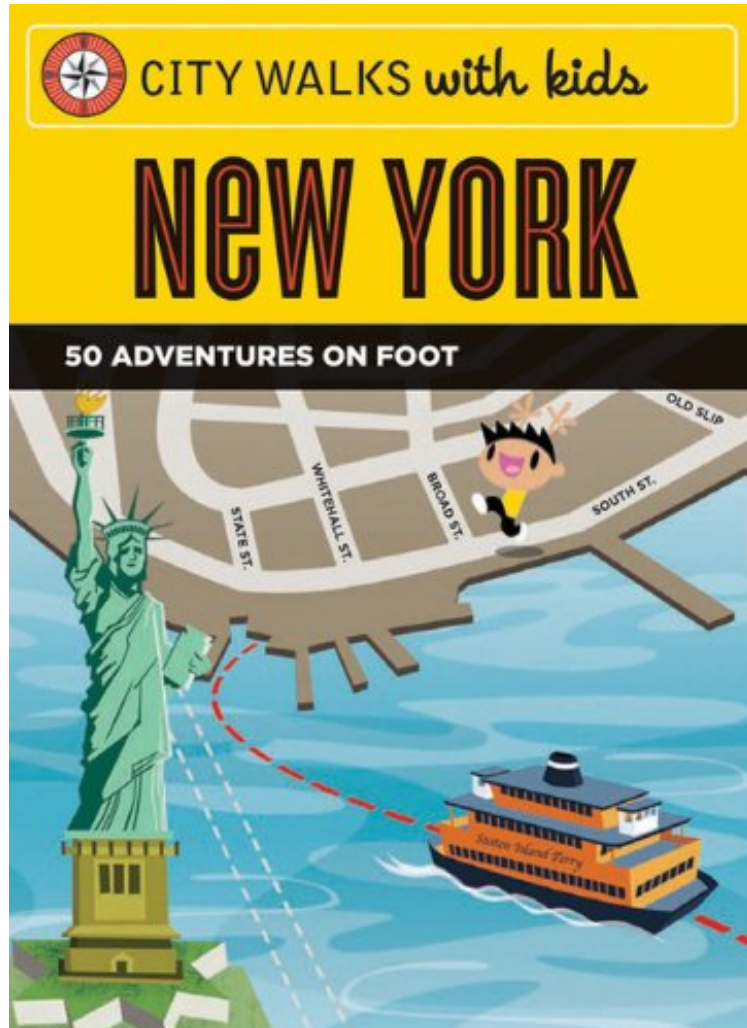

We tried the Brooklyn Bridge card which has you cross the bridge on foot (great walk!) but then instructs you to places to eat in Brooklyn and the directions were very vague and almost misleading. We have a five year old and an eight year old and, after walking the bridge, were in no mood to get lost which is exactly what we did until a police officer helped us out. These are so small they can easily slip into a purse. We picked a few out and left them in my purse to reference when we had spare time.
