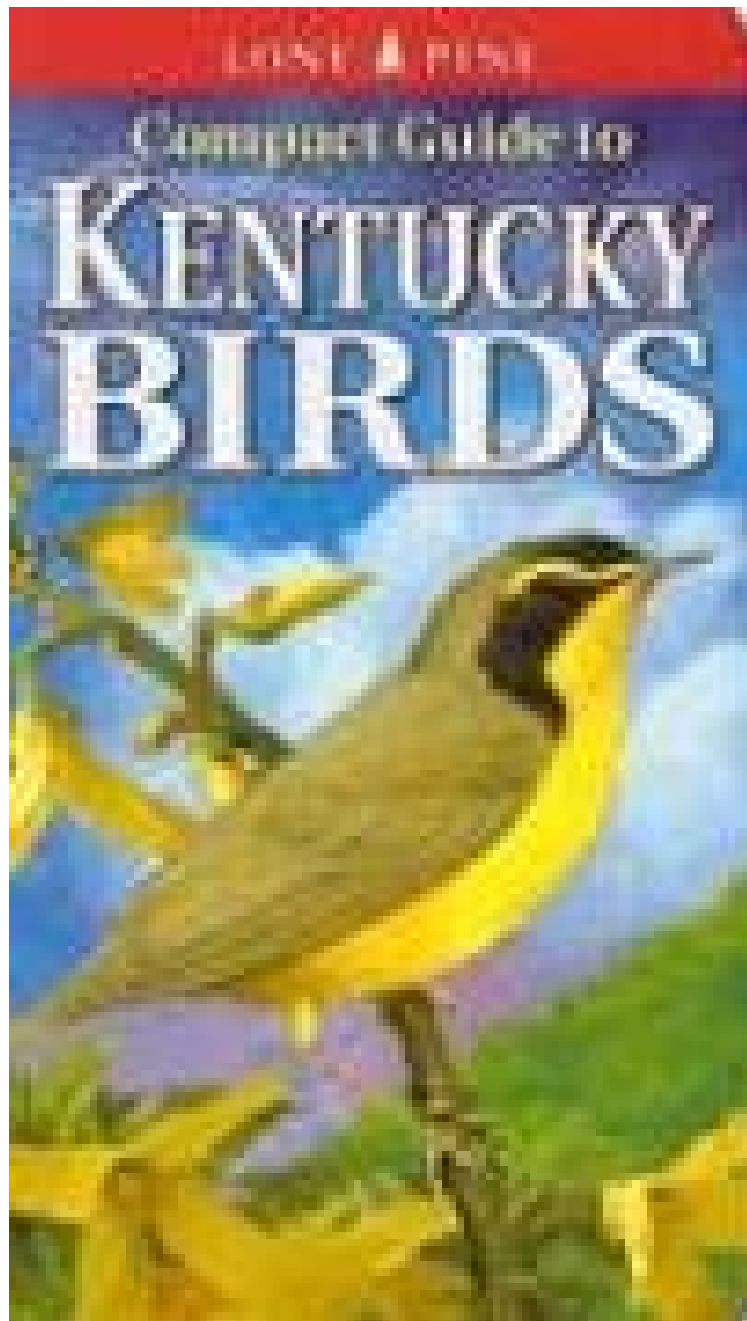

Birds are separated by types with a quick guide in the front pointing to the pages with more complete information. This information includes general information, habitat description, pictures of both the male and female, other ID, range map, pictures of similar birds, nesting information, things to look for, interesting facts and even a picture of an egg. Quite a lot for a book that fits easily into a jacket pocket. I can't recommend this book highly enough.

A great introductory field guide to the birds of Kentucky. This book features over 80 species. Each account has two pages of color illustrations and detailed information including each bird's common and scientific name, its size and voice, a range map, a photograph of the bird's egg, along with information on nesting, size of the egg and incubation period. Illustrations of similar species also are featured.
