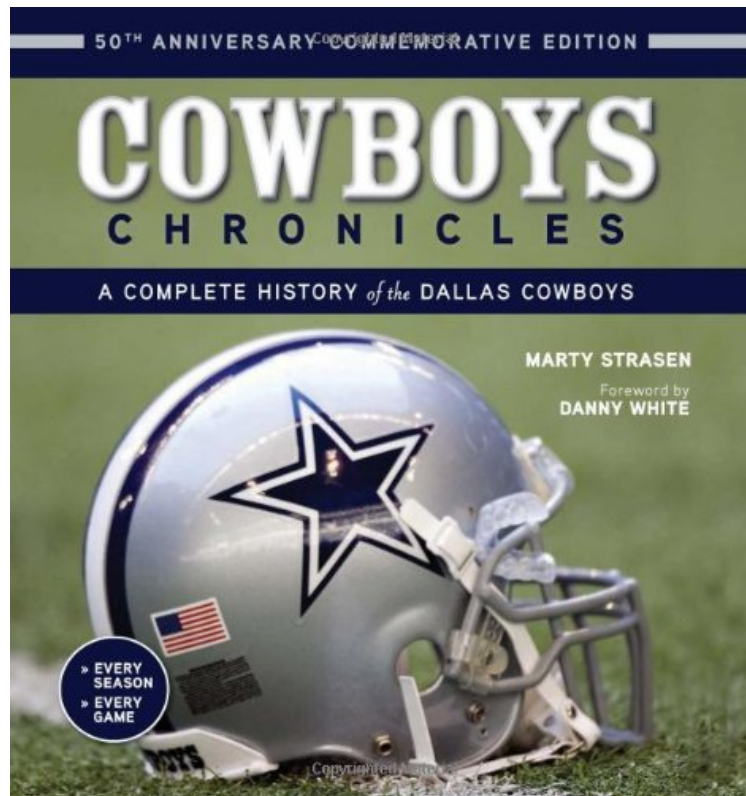

The pictures are not color and the stats are very sparse. No boxscores or team leaders or anything. This is truly a chronicle not a stats book. The win-loss record could have been put in the season summary but those are just nitpicks. Also the game chronicles stick to the facts so no description of any pre or post game events like TO dancing on the Star in '00. It sticks strictly to game facts. The book probably would have been more expensive if it did include my suggestions. The Danny White forward I could have done without though.
