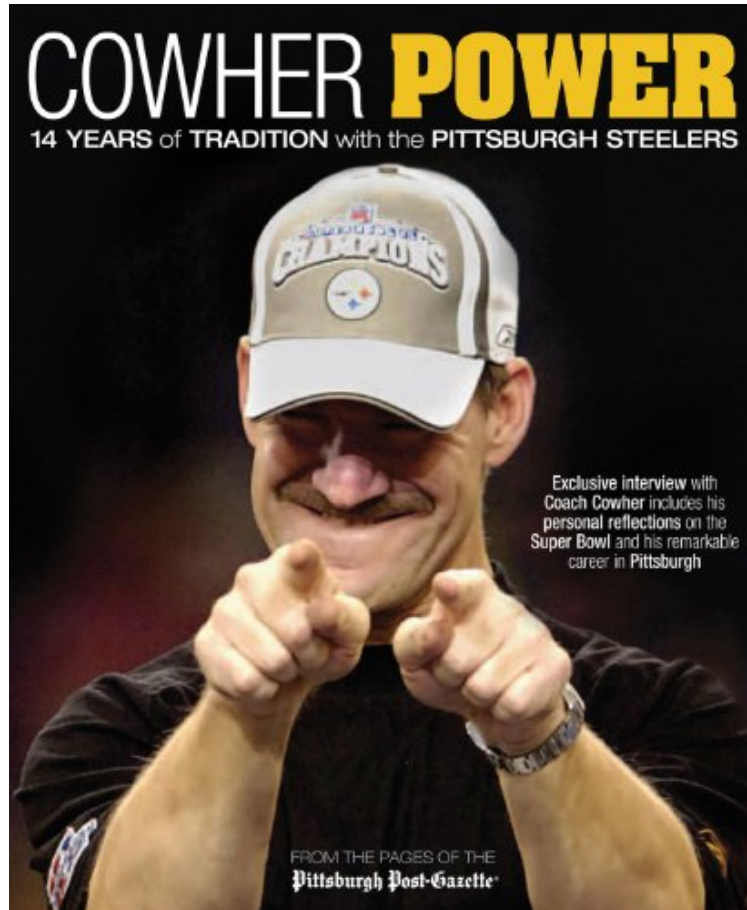

But when he finally won the big game, it was as if the Steelers were riding on a torrent of Cowher's passion and determination. The team rolled over the top three seeds in the AFC playoffs and then completed Cowher's decade-plus quest to bring a fifth Super Bowl to the Steel City with a 21-10 beating of the Seattle Seahawks in Super Bowl XL. Looking back, it's hard to imagine that Cowher had to apply for the job.
