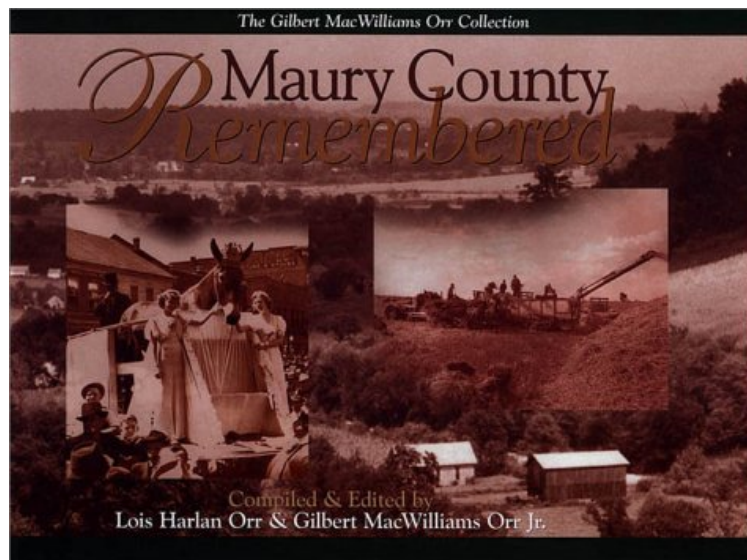

Each spring, Columbia, the county seat, celebrates "Mule Day," which has become a renowned parade and festival.
