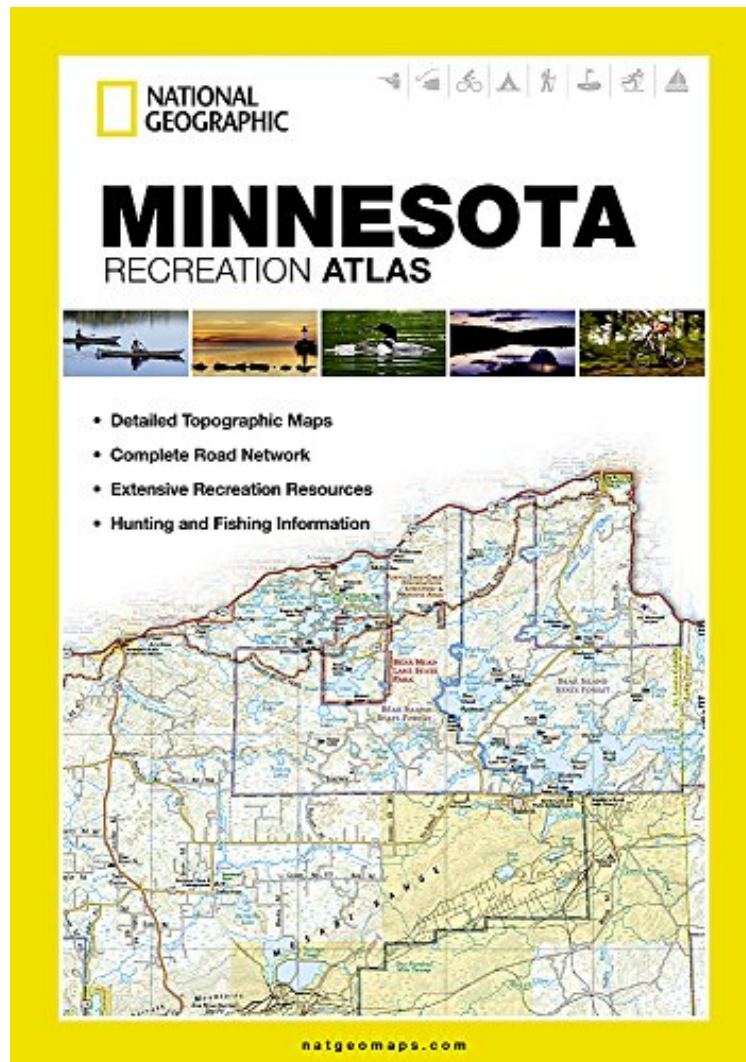

with a lot of information. On the pages 2-3 there is a U.S. highway map and on pages 4-5 there is a Minnesota highway map with an index of counties and a short index of cities and towns. Pages 6-9 are places of interest in the state and pages 10-11 have a satellite image of the state plus some climate maps. Pages 12-13 have campground information with GPS coordinates and the page of the atlas, total campsites, information about RVs, tents, trailers, showers and dumping stations. Pages 14-15 contain information about state parks and pages 16-17 is about state and national trails. Pages 18-19 show golf course (though this list has a fraction of the public courses in the state) and ski areas. Pages 20-21 map and list the best recreational lakes in the state (and with 10,000 lakes there are going to be many good ones that didn't make the list). Pages 22-23 introduce Voyageurs National Park and the Boundary Waters Canoe Area (though if you are going canoeing there even the detailed atlas pages are not enough -- you need to get special maps to show the portages and camping areas, etc). Finally, pages 24-25 contain information about hunting for bear, deer, grouse and wild turkeys. (Pheasant and duck should have been included.) Pages 26-141 are detailed topographical maps. The index to these maps is on the inside front cover -- look for the general area of the state you want and it gives the map number. There is an extensive index of cities, towns and locales. The individual map pages show parks, state national forests and wildlife areas, wilderness areas and Indian reservations. There are markers for smaller (city) parks, golf courses (including courses not listed on pgs 18-19), ski hills, camping, boat launches, fishing piers, points of interest, rest areas, lighthouses, airports and ports. In a state with 10,000 lakes and a lot of water recreation, the boat launches information is very important! the legend for these indicators and a scale is at the top of every page. I am a native Minnesotan and love my home state. I enjoy just looking through the atlas and it will be super helpful in travels around the state.
