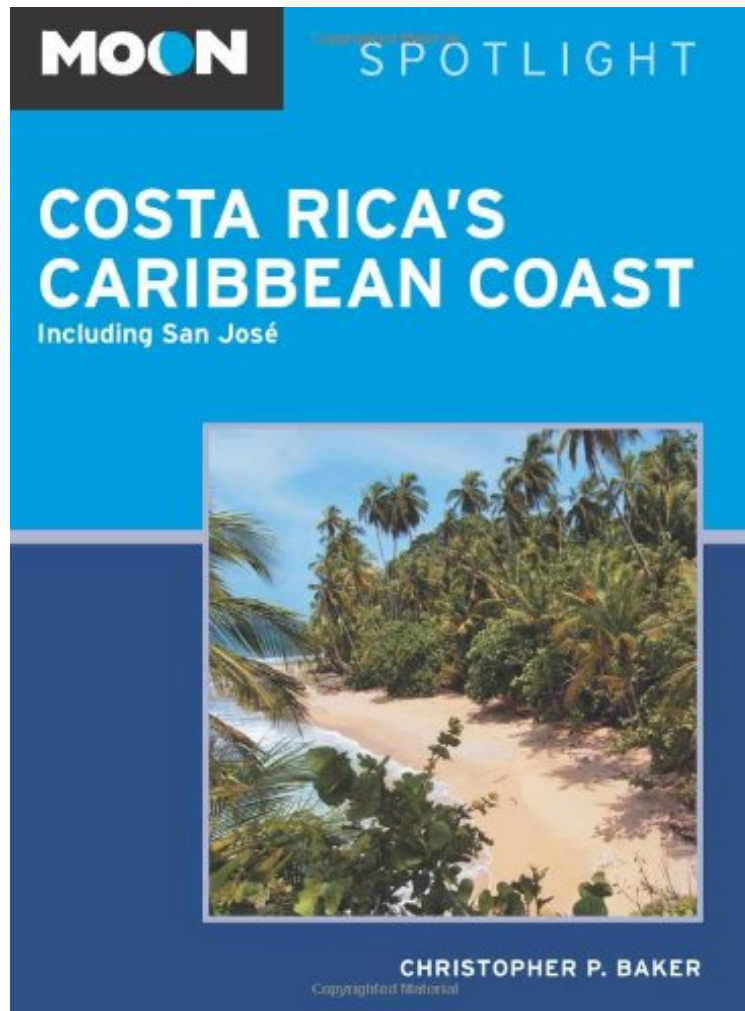

It's slim and light (just 120 pages) so it's convenient to carry in in a tote bag. It is limited to just one section of the large country - the Caribbean Coast - but that includes the port of Limon as well as the capital of San Jose. segregates info on Where to go, when to go, what to see and how to get around. The print is easy to read and so are the maps. All the pages are black and white There are short listings on accommodations but I rarely use those. Because of its size, there is less "historical" background than other books (I got a few and am reviewing each one here on) but it's a nice slim guide. There are no pull-out maps so you might want to either copy them or just tear out the ones you need. He is acclaimed for his specialist knowledge of Cuba and Costa Rica, about which he has written 10 books, and created the Costa Rica Pura Vida! travel app. His many books include Moon Cuba and Mi Moto Fidel: Motorcycling Through Castro's Cuba, winner of both the 2002 Lowell Thomas Award for Best Travel Book and the North American Travel Journalist Association's Grand Prize.
