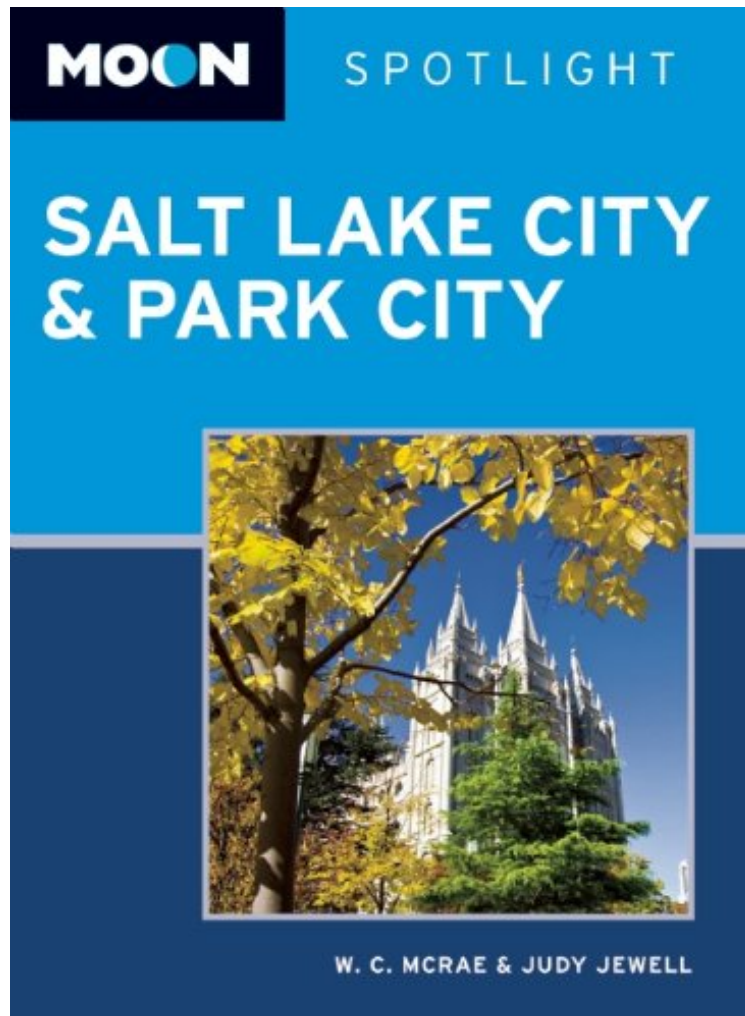

purchased this guide book exclusively for the Park City information and did not read the Salt Lake City section, so I cannot comment on that part. The Park City section has very basic information, but not much of anything in depth - nothing you wouldn't find out by just looking at the Park City visitor's bureau website. If you have no previous knowledge of Park City or the activities available there, I think it could be helpful. One thing it does do is describe each of the three ski resorts, and that might help you get an idea of which one you want to visit. But you can also find the same information on each respective ski resort's website. So if you aren't planning on doing any other research for a visit to Park City, I would recommend it, but I felt like it was a waste of time. (Not much time, though...did I mention the section on Park City is very short.)

This is one of the few guides that I could find that focused on Salt Lake City, Park City, and the surrounding ski areas. I was a bit skeptical because there were no previous reviews, but the price was right so I took a chance and bought the book. I'm really glad I did--not only did it give an accurate and comprehensive overview of the cities and local ski areas, it also had neat "off the beaten path" ideas, like visiting a natural crater in Heber City for a swim in a hot spring. Maps, restaurant recommendations, and basic information and tips were spot-on. The book is lightweight and easy to carry in a purse or backpack. I would highly recommend it.
